


Water Supply Status




New Groundwater Wells

- 3 new wells completed
- Serve as drought water supply
- Serve as emergency water supply
- Operate at less than ½ the cost of the Lake McClure pumps
- Help with compliance with state requirements
 - Outside place of use
 - Health and safety of the community

- On District Property
- Produces 145,000 gallons per day
- Can serve approx. 1000 customers



District Finances

- \$1 million in reserve funds used to leverage \$3 million in grants in 2015/2016
- All accounting work completed by CPA firm
 - Meets all requirements of state law
 - Meets all government and generally accepted accounting practices
- Annual budget
- Monthly financial performance reporting
- Annual audits are clean with no recommended improvements needed

Regional Water Conservation Program

- \$175,260 grant from Department of Water Resources (State Proposition 84)
- Regional program starting in Don Pedro
 - In-home water use evaluations
 - Water efficiency kits
 - Rebates for greywater and rainwater systems, irrigation improvements, shower heads and toilet replacements
